Reforms in Review Part 4: Cutting Corruption and Professionalizing the Security Sector

Corruption in the security sector over the past decade has cost Afghanistan heavily in human and financial resources needed to protect citizens and enforce rule of law. Sweeping and unprecedented reforms have been on-going at the Ministry of Interior Affairs and Ministry of Defense since 2014 to cut corruption, install systems of accountability and transparency, and establish responsible and qualified leadership. The goals of reforms are to 1) create effective governance of the security sector by introducing transparent, civilian systems, called 'civilianization' or 'professionalization' of the security sector, and 2) end security sector corruption.
